ABOUT SILVER LAKE COLLEGE:

Silver Lake College of the Holy Family is a Catholic, liberal arts-based, co-educational institution sponsored by the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity who founded the College in 1935 and continue to be an integral part of its life and mission. Silver Lake College is located on the shores of Silver Lake and minutes from the sandy beaches of Lake Michigan. The College is a highly respected and active member of the Lakeshore community.

Located in Manitowoc, WI, Silver Lake College currently enrolls approximately 700 students, including over 200 traditional undergraduate students, graduate students, and adult learners. Undergraduate degrees are granted in 45+ areas of study which features a quality liberal arts education integrated with professional preparation. Graduate degrees are conferred in Education, Leadership and Organizational Development, and Music – Kodaly Emphasis.

The organizational culture intentionally focuses on the values that are consistent with Silver Lake's Franciscan influence including genuine care, respect and compassion for others, the community, and all creation. The campus climate is serene, also consistent with the peacemaking organizational value, but don't confuse that with the level of engagement present among all members of the community. Silver Lake College is a small community, but large in vision and future. Programs like SLC Works, undergraduate student learning communities, and the many other student-centric initiatives focus on impacting the success of our students. Recently hired employees consistently mention the energy and excitement that is present at the College, and the genuineness of character among, staff, students and faculty.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Silver Lake College is seeking applicants for an adjunct faculty position teaching Philosophy courses within the General Education program. This position participates in course development, evaluation of student achievement, course evaluation and other matters as assigned in accordance with the mission, core values, and purposes of the college. Instructor needs to be available for in-person, traditional course delivery.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

The adjunct faculty member must satisfy the following minimum qualifications:

1. Master's degree in Philosophy required; significant course work in scholastic philosophical tradition
2. Previous teaching experience preferred; especially in the area/areas of teaching responsibility; knowledge and skills related to teaching adults, teaching methodology, curriculum development, evaluation, or willingness to plan for acquisition of these skills no later than the first year of teaching.
3. Ability to teach Logic according to the following descriptions.
 - a. Logic: *This course provides an introduction to logical theory and classical rules of correct reasoning, both inductive and deductive. This course will cover the nature of definitions, propositions, and reasoning (syllogisms) as well as the identification of logical fallacies.*
4. Knowledge of and adherence to the principles for higher education outlined in Ex Corde Ecclesiae and the Application to the United States (http://old.usccb.org/bishops/application_of_excordeecclesiae.shtml).

SKILLS AND ATTRIBUTES:

The adjunct faculty member must possess the following skills and attributes:

1. Excellent communication and interpersonal skills are required.
2. Willingness to support the Mission of the College and to work collaboratively and collegially.
3. Willingness to work in tandem with the Theology Program
4. Willingness to attend yearly adjunct instructor training
